Goal 2: How will the district provide coordination, technical assistance, and other support necessary to assist participating schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement?

The district will assign a parent involvement coordinator at each school to improve communication among teachers and parents. Technology will be accessible to parents in order for them to come into the school and use its technology in order to access student related resources, etc.
